The Tallahassee Stamp & Cover will sponsor its third annual show with activities for all ages.

The show runs March 24 and 25. The show is free, and this year will have eight dealers from Florida and Tennessee. It will be open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday and 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Sunday. The show will be held at the Tallahassee Senior Center, at the corner of Seventh Avenue and North Monroe Street.

Exhibits will showcase collections and specialty items from local philatelists and give some ideas of the many different methods of collecting. Door prizes will be awarded every two hours. A beginners learning area will teach the basics of stamp collecting.

Dealers will have most anything you need for your

collecting interests including mint and used stamps, covers, used albums from the United States and the rest of the world. One dealer also will have coins to sell. The dealers are here to both buy and sell stamps and collections, so come and talk with them about your needs. If your collection is small, bring it to the show for appraisal. Larger collections can be seen by the dealer at an arranged location and time.

Members of the TS&CC club will be available for free appraisals and may be able to help with advice about what you may want to do with your collection.
